The La Palma-Cerritos branch has sponsored students to camps at Stanford and University of California San Diego and currently sponsors girls to Whittier College.

## **Public Policy**

For more than a century, AAUW has influenced legislative debate on such critical issues as education, social security, discrimination. civil rights, reproductive choice, affirmative action, Title IX, welfare reform, vocational education, pay equity, family and medical leave, and health care reform. AAUW has legislative lobbyists at the State and Federal levels of government who lobby on AAUW's behalf and inform the members of crucial issues and what can be done to affect their passage or defeat. The branch public policy chair seeks to aid members in gaining skill and understanding in the legislative process.

## **Community Action Partnership**

To fulfill AAUW's commitment to supporting women in the community, the La Palma-Cerritos Branch works in partnership with the Su Casa Family Crisis and Support Center for battered women and children and other community based projects.

We have a close relationship with Cerritos Community College and actively work to assist and encourage women to move on to higher education after that phase of their education.
